California TPA Credentialing FAQ – Practitioners

- Not all practitioners will be credentialed:
 - Licensed practitioners (such as Nurses, Licensed Clinical Social Workers, etc.) will undergo the full credentialing process.
 - Practitioners who are already credentialed with Carelon Behavioral Health will not need to be credentialed a second time.
 - PPS practitioners will undergo a truncated screening process.
 - Registered, Certified and unlicensed practitioners (such as Associates, AODCs and Community Health Workers) will be linked to their LEA for quality purposes.
- Practitioners who are in scope for any credentialing/screening processes (as indicated above) must complete a credentialing application. The rest will be loaded systematically.
- Receiving SPI data will initiate the credentialing/screening processes for the applicable practitioner types, but the SPI does not constitute a credentialing application.
 - Practitioners who maintain a current CAQH profile and have granted Carelon access to their information will not need to complete a separate credentialing application.
 - o Practitioners who do *not* use CAQH will be sent a Carelon-developed credentialing application which can be completed electronically and returned via email, fax, or mail.
 - SSN is not required on the SPI but is required to complete the credentialing processes due to it being a key identifier in performing all necessary sanctions checks and monthly ongoing monitoring.
- <u>Licensed Practitioners</u>: The full credentialing process includes verification of identity (Name, DOB, SSN, NPI), education, work history, licenses, board certification (Nurses, PAs and Physicians only), malpractice, NPDB, various sanctions checks, etc.
 - Recredentialing is required within 36 months of the last credentialing approval date. This is a seamless process – practitioners will only hear from us if credentialing requirements are not available leading up to the recredentialing due date.
 - Licensed practitioners may be denied credentialing if they do not meet the credentialing criteria. If denied, they may reapply if the reason for the original denial has been satisfied.
- <u>PPS Practitioners</u>: The truncated screening process includes verification of identity (Name, DOB, SSN, NPI), PPS Credential, NPI, various sanctions checks, etc.
- A notice of credentialing approval will be sent via email and/or fax upon completion of credentialing activities and approval by the Credentialing Committee
- Credentialing activities will be terminated if licensed and PPS practitioners do not supply the required information/documentation upon request. The process can be reinstated once the information is received.

Practitioners who require an NPI are responsible for completing this process via NPPES.

Practitioners who wish to streamline the credentialing process are encouraged to use <u>CAQH</u>.

Practitioners who are required to enroll in Medi-Cal are responsible for completing this process via PAVE.
